What is it?

'I Can Tell' is a school and community-based program for Pre-K through 5th graders, aimed to reducing child sexual abuse. This 30 minute program breaks down secrecy around abuse by teaching children they can tell an adult if they are feeling unsafe.

Did you know?

Statistics show that roughly 1 in 10 children will be sexually abused before they are eighteen years old, and of those victimized only about 38% choose to disclose that they have been sexually abused. One of the primary barriers to children reporting sexual abuse is fear.

During this program, we empower children to speak out about their abuse, lessening that fear.

Goals

1. To reduce childhood sexual abuse through early identification and reporting.
2. Empower children to tell trusted adults when they feel unsafe.
3. Teach children how to identify abuse.

History

I Can Tell originally called Kindervision, was developed in 1994 by Womanline as an educational curriculum to reduce the prevalence of child sexual abuse by imparting basic, but essential information to young children, teachers and parents.
